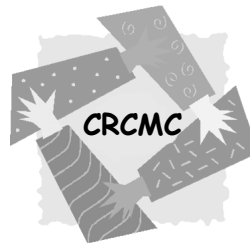

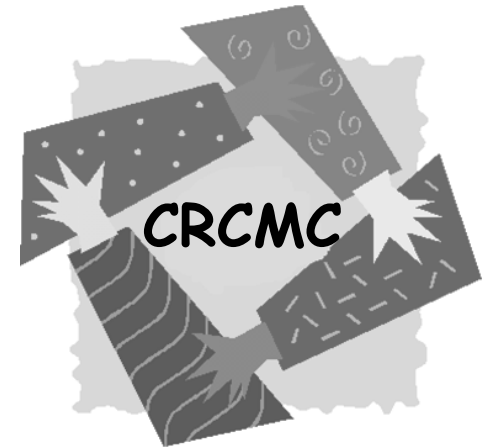

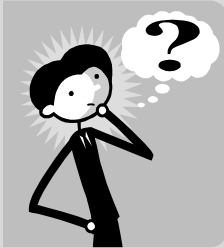

- Do you need to plan for the care of an elderly parent?
- Do you owe someone money and want to come up with a payment plan that works for both of you?
- Do your neighborhood meetings always end in more bad feelings than solutions?
- Are you having problems communicating with your teenager?

Our Services

Mediation

In mediation, two or more participants in a dispute get together with the help of neutral mediators who assist them to develop their own solutions according to their needs and values. Mediation is voluntary and confidential.

Youth Programs

Through Community Conferencing and Dialogue Circles, CRCMC offers an alternative method for schools to handle conflict. Both use Restorative Justice principles to build empathy and community among students.

Facilitation

In a facilitated meeting, facilitators offer a productive group process by focusing on the task, stimulating constructive debate, promoting equal member participation, and helping team building.

Conflict Resolution Education

CRCMC offers education and skills building in mediation, facilitation, improving communication, listening skills and resolving conflicts.
